## Steven Brindle, Music Director



Steven Brindle is a conductor, cellist, and music educator based in Norfolk, Virginia. He earned his degree in Music Education from Christopher Newport University and pursued conducting studies at the University of Cincinnati's College-Conservatory of Music and the Peabody Conservatory. Since 2013, he has served as founding Music Director of the Hampton Roads Philharmonic and, since 2016, conductor of the Bay Youth Concert Orchestra. He has also led productions with Tidewater Opera Initiative, Symphoncity (The Nutcracker), and Capitol Opera Richmond. A strong advocate for new music, Steven has premiered over a dozen works, including David and Glass by Chris Lamb and The Snow Maiden of Appalachia by Andrew H. Austin. He teaches at The Academy of Music and Ghent Montessori School and is an active member of multiple music and academic honor societies.



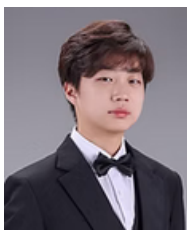
## Reese Tunstall, Assistant Conductor

Reese Tunstall is completing a Master of Arts in Teaching at Christopher Newport University, focusing on Instrumental Music Education. He serves as Graduate Assistant for The Marching Captains, studies conducting with Dr. Mark Reimer, and student-teaches with Nathan Cabello and Brian Grieb. A skilled saxophonist, Reese performed the solo in Rachmaninoff's Symphonic Dances at the Brevard Music Center and won the 2022 CNU Aria-Concerto Competition. His academic work includes a lecture recital on Ryō Noda's *Maï* and publication in *The Cupola*. Reese brings passion, scholarship, and leadership to his work as both performer and educator.



## David Perrot, Pianist

David Perrott studied piano at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music and earned a Licentiate in Piano Performance from the Australian Music Examinations Board. He later completed a Ph.D. in Social Psychology at Northwestern University and now works as a jury consultant in New York City. After a long break from music, David returned to piano as a personal resolution—leading to the realization of a longtime dream: studying and performing Beethoven's Emperor Concerto. He lives in Brooklyn with his dog, Matilda, who turns 12 the day before this performance.



## Connor Kim, Pianist

Connor Kim is an eighth-grade pianist at Liberty Middle School in Virginia. He began piano at age five with Dr. Mihyang Joo and has since earned first place in the 2025 NVMTA Robert Spencer Concerto Competition, AYPO Concerto Competition, and Fairfax Bland Music Competition. A pianist with the American Youth Philharmonic Orchestra since 2022, he will solo with AYCO in May 2025. Connor also performs in chamber groups through Topaz Ensembles, winning multiple national awards. Beyond piano, he studies cello, plays percussion, and trains in Taekwondo. His musical focus includes Chopin and a wide range of solo and ensemble repertoire.
